



ADVENTURE CHALLENGE: FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. Where do we start and Finish?

This is a new meeting point due to expected inclement weather. You are starting and finishing at the Easter Seals Office, 3670 Kempt Road. GPS Coordinates are: N 44 39.761, W 063 37.142

2. Where do I park?

Parking is available at the side and in front of the office.

3. What if my team doesn't fundraise the minimum of \$500?

If you have raised a minimum of \$100 you can participate in the event but will not be eligible for the grand prize of 4 tickets anywhere WestJet flies. There are still some great FTF prizes, coupons, gift certificates etc. that you will be eligible for.

4. Can I bring my donations to the event?

Yes, you can bring all your donations to the event. We will have representatives from our accounting department on hand to take the rest of your funds.

5. What is the Cache Passport?

The Cache Passport is the listing of the over 50 caches throughout HRM for this event. When you locate a cache, you will stamp your passport beside the cache listing. Guard this passport with your life. It is the proof that you found the caches and it is what we use to assign you your points.

6. Does my team have to stick together?

Absolutely Yes! You all have to be present when you find a cache. This is to ensure fairness for all participating teams as some have less than 4 members. Even the driver has to leave the car. If you are found to have separated and are not working together as a group, you will be disqualified. At registration you will have your team picture taken. Some caches will have a volunteer nearby to ensure the whole team is there and may ask you to show your team picture.

7. Will we have time before the start to strategize our moves?

At 9:45am you will be given a map of HRM and your Cache Passport with all the coordinates listed with their point values. You have until the 10:00am start to plan your starting strategy.

8. Do we have to find the caches in any specific order?

No, you find them in whatever order you want to accumulate as many points as you can. They are not listed in the Cache Passport in any specific order.



9. What happens if we cannot find a cache?

Some of our caches will be very challenging. This will usually be reflected in the point value. As with normal geocaching, it can happen that sometimes a cache is not put back in the right place, or it has been removed. This is a normal risk of geocaching. However, if a cache is reported to event staff as missing or the contents have been removed and it is suspicious, the cache will be voided and no points will be awarded to any team for that cache.

10. What happens if a cache is compromised?

If a cache has been compromised because it is believed that someone not registered in event or that someone is acting without team members has attended a cache it will be deemed compromised and will be voided – no points will be awarded to any team.

11. What is inside the caches?

You will find a variety of things contained in the caches. The key item contained in the cache is either a stamp, a sticker or another item to be placed in your passport or instructions on what to do next to validate your passport. There could also be multiple “First to Find” prizes, coupons or gift certificates. Only take one item per team unless otherwise indicated. In this challenge, there is no need to “put in” these caches. Also please note that there will be no “log book” as in traditional caches.

12. What happens if our team returns after 2:00pm?

Your team will lose points for every 5 minutes you are past 2:00pm.

13. What happens in the event of a tie (for most points)

The winner will be determined as the team which crosses the finish line first.

14. What happens if I arrive at a cache location and another team is there?

Please respect others, if someone is with the cache stand aside until they have what they need.
