86 years of Camp Tidnish magic! As we head into our 86th year, our Camp Director is busy planning for another fun filled summer. Staff recruitment began in the fall of 2022, and we're delighted to have a record number of Camp Tidnish staff returning for the 2023 season. Our camper registration began to open in January and our Camp Tidnish Scholarships are now accepting applications. ## **Current Camp Tidnish Scholarship Opportunities:**

• The Durham Laporte Memorial Scholarship is established in memory of Durham Laporte, who was a Camp Tidnish Counsellor that suddenly passed away at the young age of 25.

To honour Durham and his love of Camp Tidnish, his family has created this scholarship, which will be awarded to one camper per year and will cover the enrollment fee for a one-week session at Camp Tidnish for an adult over the age of 19 with a disability who is living in a Residential Care Facility. Applications for the Durham Laporte Memorial Scholarship are open until March 30th each year, and the recipient will be announced mid April.

• The Finley Mills Memorial Scholarship is established in memory of Finley Mills, who was born with Down Syndrome and passed away at the tender age of 3.5 months old. To honour Finley, his family created this scholarship which will be awarded to one camper per year and will cover the enrollment fee for a one-week session at Camp Tidnish.

<u>Terms of Reference for the Finley Mills Memorial Scholarship:</u> Awarded to an individual of any age with Down Syndrome, preference will be given to those applicants who demonstrate financial hardship, applicants must be residents of Nova Scotia.

Applications for the Finley Mills Memorial Scholarship are open until March 31st each year, and the recipient will be announced mid April. The Scholarship winner will be selected by a committee compromised of Easter Seals Nova Scotia representatives in conjunction with Finley's family.

• Kim Wry Bursary for Camp Tidnish is provided by The Zonta Club of Amherst Area and is established in memory of Kim Wry. Members of the Zonta Club of Amherst Area look forward to joining Easter Seals Nova Scotia and the Rotary Club of Amherst in supporting a woman (19 years +) from Cumberland County to attend Camp Tidnish with its wonderful programs for individuals with physical and/or intellectual disabilities. Applications for the Kim Wry Bursary must be submitted by April 15th.

New Leaf has had a busy start to 2023! Clients participated in a Transit Training program offered by Halifax Transit which teaches individuals how to navigate bus routes, terminals and plan trips using public transportation. After a few workshops based in our center, clients had the opportunity to plan a trip and put what they learned into practice. A small group of our clients decided they would take the ferry over to Halifax and bus back to Dartmouth, stopping along the way to tour the bridge terminal and practice calling 311 to ask for bus times. When they arrived back to Dartmouth, they celebrated with hot chocolate! We're looking forward to planning more outings and community experiences as we get into the warmer months.

In addition to going out into the community we've also had an in house presentation from DivertNS and have been working on our reoccurring contracts with local businesses.

The Next Step Employment program has continued to help our clients ages 17 to 30 reach their employment goals. We have been facilitating workshops to help strengthen employability skills. Most recently, we have been sharing information with schools in the Halifax Regional Centre for Education (HRCE) and hosting Reverse Job Fairs, which have proven to be successful as several clients have obtained employment. When employment has been secured by the client, they receive a period of on-site job coach support. The goal of the program is to promote independence so the job coach will gradually phase out. To date, we have secured 25 employment opportunities for our clients.

The clients and staff who work in our industrial kitchen as part of New Leaf Enterprises continue to produce wonderful products. Whether it be putting good knife skills to use, or using the scale to weigh dry ingredients, our clients use their acquired skills daily and are key contributors to all aspects of kitchen life! The Assisted Mobility Program is undergoing some exciting changes this year. We started the year off by opening a satellite office, the first one for Easter Seals Nova Scotia, in Yarmouth. This expansion will allow a greater reach and increase response times for our clients in the Western region of the province who use our programs and services. It will also increase our inventory capability, which in conjunction with our new streamlined equipment offerings will provide a quicker application and delivery of equipment process.

Our Assistive Devices program will be starting a new grant program on **April 1, 2023**, allowing clients to apply for funding of custom assistive devices that are typically not covered under any programs in Nova Scotia. The ability to fund these devices, which range from communication devices to custom orthotics will allow clients to improve their independence, and reach their goals, as access to appropriate equipment must be the first step in an inclusive community.
