We immediately thought of Austin Cleveland, a 15-year-old boy living with Cerebral Palsy who loves to play sledge hockey. The match was successful and on September 26th, 2023, Easter Seals Nova Scotia CEO Joanne Bernard and our Multi-Program Coordinators Annette Hill and Greg MacKay travelled to Austin's home in Shubenacadie to witness Austin's unveiling of The Rig; a fully electric and accessible four-wheeled bike used for off-roading, one of Austin's passions.

Family, neighbours and Austin's School Principal witnessed a smile as big as the outdoors as Austin quickly learned the controls and capabilities of his new mode of independent transportation and fun. Thank you to the Shine Foundation for partnering with us to provide this once-in-a-lifetime opportunity for Austin and his family!







We had an amazing two weeks of making new friends and learning new skills at Learn to Ride in July! Our Learn to Ride program for children and youth is run in partnership with Serenity Acres Family Ranch. This program promotes the development of healthy life skills for educational, professional and personal development through equine-assisted activities.

Newcomers to Canada, Yousef's father reached out to us through other community resources to enroll his son into an inclusive sport. Yousef quickly found a safe place to play with our Learn to Wheel program at St. Andrew's Centre. Yousef has made many new friends and learned new skills. Having the programs offered free of charge has been a tremendous benefit to Yousef's family as they begin their new lives in Nova Scotia.





Over the last couple of months, New Leaf Enterprises has had many fantastic opportunities to invite guest speakers in to share information about Sun Safety, Truth & Reconciliation, and Vermicomposting. Clients have been participating in Learn to Dance, Art Classes, Music Therapy and have just started an eight-week Improv for Anxiety program.

New Leaf has done two pop-up markets at Alderney Landing selling our candles, bath bombs, beeswax wraps and baked goods. These products are also available for purchase at New Leaf Cafe at 22 Fielding Avenue in Burnside. With the Holiday season approaching we are also busy preparing products for our 5th Annual Ability Makers Christmas Market taking place on December 1st and 2nd this year.

Assisted Mobility

Over the past few months, the Assisted Mobility program has continued to provide grants and equipment for Nova Scotian families in need. We were able to provide 21 grants to Nova Scotians through our Adaptive Support Fund. Items ranged from communication devices to AFOs (Ankle Foot Orthosis), adaptive tricycles, and mobility aids. We are looking forward to re-opening applications in April 2024 with more opportunities to alleviate the cost of adaptive supports for Nova Scotian individuals and families.

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Through our partners at Easter Seals Canada and CIBC, we also completed the AccessABILITY grant that provides grants for children ages 14 and under. This

grant went out to five recipients throughout Nova Scotia and provided communication aides, adaptive car seats and bath aides. Connor, a non-verbal four-year-old with Autism received an iPad with Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC) software. This device will allow Connor to better express his wants, ask guestions, interact with other children at school and more easily engage with family members.
